- "Hispanic/Latina women were paid 54% of what white men were paid in 2013" (1)
- In 2017, 6.4% of fortune 500 CEOs were women that's 32/500 (2)
- 19.6% of Congress (both houses) are women. 105/535 seats (2)
- In 2016 the U.S. was 26th in the world in equality in pay between genders (2)
- Pay Gap: White women = 75 cents to one dollar, 85 cents for Asian women, 63 for Black women and 54 for Latina women (2)
- 10 Million women a year are victims of domestic violence (2)
- As of 2014, there have been 468 state legislations regulating women's bodies, but none for men's (1)
- In the EU, 45-55% of women experienced sexual harassment after the age of 15. (5)
- ⅓ women worldwide have experienced sexual or physical violence, and most of that is from an intimate partner (5)
- In 2012, half of women killed were killed by their family or partners. (5)
- "37 countries exempt rape perpetrators from prosecution when they are married to or subsequently marry the victim." (5)
- "Two-thirds of countries have outlawed domestic violence." (5)
- "Almost 750 Million women and girls alive today were married before their 18th birthday." (5)
- "26% of people employed in computer and mathematical occupations are women." (6)
- "57% of women participate in the labor force" (6)

- An Organization(Global fund for women) that is one of the many companies support them very much that they get fundings to then help spread their word on how this act has been such an important event in our world. (3)
- Not just Organizations support women's rights, people in society, people who are and aren't famous, still support this moment, even unconsciously, now it is kinda hard to think that women were treated badly compared to now.

- Over half of women who have abortions are under the age of 25 (11) they don't like this
 - 30% of teen girls who drop out of school say it's because of pregnancy and parenthood (12)
 - "Only 40 percent of teen mothers finish high school. Fewer than 2 percent finish college by age 30." (12)
